4. What's happening?

- a As the magnet moves through a metal tube it produces an **electric field** around the tube *(these are called eddy currents)*.
- b This electric field produces a **magnetic field** around the tube.
- c This magnetic field acts in the **opposite** direction to the field of the moving magnet and repels it.
- d This **slows** the speed at which the magnet falls by opposing the force of gravity.
- e The opposing force is **greater** for better electrical conductors. In other words, good conductors slow the magnet more
